Why is it important to have a molecular profile?

Knowing what cancer looks like at the molecular level may lead to better treatment options. Regardless of where a tumor is located, its molecular composition can tell your physician how the cancer may behave and what treatments may be most effective for you.

What is Caris molecular profiling?

Caris molecular profiling is the first and most experienced comprehensive tumor profiling service designed to help patients better fight cancer. Our approach to tumor profiling assesses every possible gene (22,000) in the DNA and RNA, as well as proteins to reveal a molecular blueprint to guide more precise and individualized treatment decisions for your cancer.

How long does it take for results?

Your oncologist receives your results back in about 10-14 days, which is then used to help inform the best treatment plan to fight your disease.

Is Caris molecular testing covered by insurance?

Yes, on average 9 out of 10 insured patients pay no out-of-pocket costs. Caris molecular testing is typically reimbursed by most insurance providers, as well as Medicare. Additionally, we offer financial assistance programs that provide added financial flexibility for uninsured patients or patients who may not be able to afford out-of-pocket costs associated with molecular testing.

What patient support does Caris provide?

Once testing is ordered, a Patient Navigator is assigned to work directly with you through all aspects of molecular profiling, including how the testing works, insurance verification, financial options, and many others.
